Durham Region is home to over 750,000 people and growing, yet one essential need remains unmet for residents in the central and western communities of our region: access to a dedicated end-of-life hospice residence. Without a hospice residence close to home, families in Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax and Pickering, must travel long distances to access end-of-life care for their loved ones.

We are changing that! Our capital campaign to raise the funds needed to build our new hospice residence is underway, and I am happy to share that we have **raised just over \$11 million for Hospice Whitby – Roger Anderson House.** I am inspired by the commitment of so many leaders in Whitby and throughout the region who have stepped forward to champion this important project.

We are deeply grateful to the **Town of Whitby for their generous donation of the land for Hospice Whitby – Roger Anderson House** as well as all of our donors whose unwavering support has brought us this far. Construction is progressing steadily, and we are on track to open our doors in fall 2026 however, we still need to **raise the final \$4.5 million** to complete the build, fully furnish the space, and equip it to provide the highest standard for care.

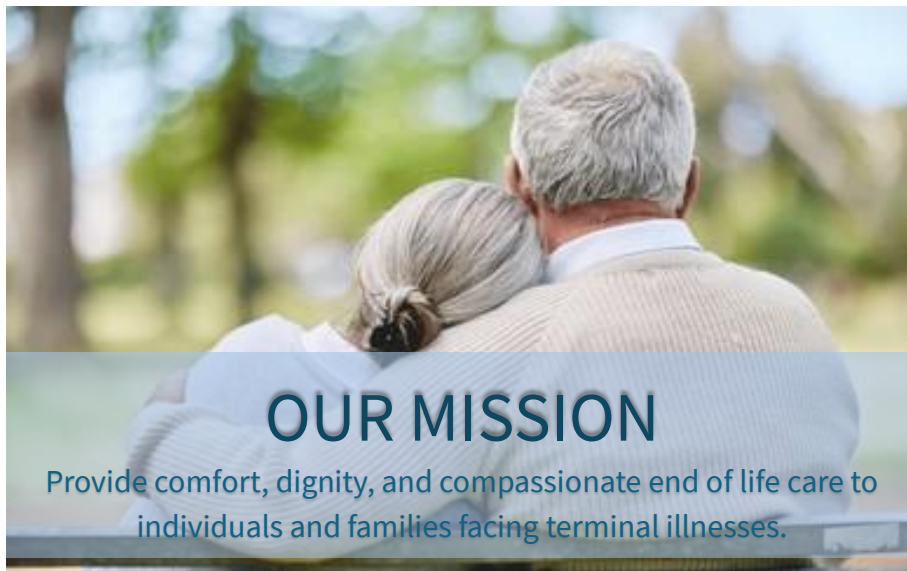
While we have made considerable progress in our fundraising efforts, reaching our goal will require continued collaboration and support from leaders, businesses, organizations, and the broader community.

What Is Hospice Care

A hospice residence provides a specialized approach to supporting people with a terminal illness when curative treatment is no longer the goal. It prioritizes the comfort, dignity, and emotional well-being that everyone deserves at the end-of-life.

A hospice residence offers a peaceful, tranquil, home-like setting where individuals receive round-the-clock care in an environment designed to ensure proactive pain management, comfort and compassion. It gives families space to be present, to feel supported, and to be relieved of the weight of caregiving responsibilities.

As our communities grow and age, a hospice residence becomes essential, not only as an alternative to hospital-based end-of-life care, but as a reflection of our collective commitment to honouring life's final journey.

As soon as we walked into the hospice, I was overcome by how peaceful and beautiful it felt. The warmth in everyone's greetings touched my heart. "Please get yourself settled and then come to the dining room and have some lunch," were the first words said to us when we walked in. There was such genuine kindness in every smile. In that moment, I felt an unexpected calm wash over me, like I knew it was exactly where mom needed to be. Diana

Why Hospice Care Matters in Durham Region

Durham Region is experiencing unprecedented growth and an increasingly aging population. By 2051, the region is projected to welcome more than half a million new residents, bringing the total population to approximately 1.3 million, with significant growth in Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax and Pickering. People in these communities, more than three-quarters of the region’s population, live more than a half-hour drive from a hospice residence.

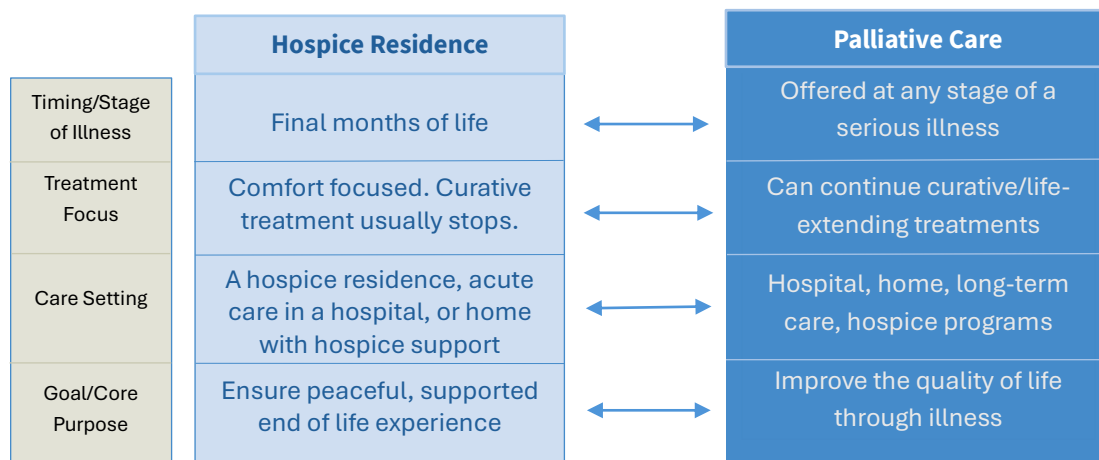
The population is aging faster than overall growth figures suggest. Projections indicate that by 2031, one in three Durham residents will be 65 years of age or older, significantly higher than the provincial average of 22 per cent. This dramatic shift in age profile means the region must prepare for a substantial increase in age-related health and social care needs.

As the population ages, more individuals are living with chronic illnesses, reduced mobility and are facing end of life needs. Consequently, the demand for specialized hospice care is expected to rise dramatically. The ongoing influx of immigrants also contributes to this demand, as many newcomers may not have the support of extended family networks in Canada.

Hospice residences play a crucial role in supporting both residents and families through challenging times.

By offering comprehensive, personalized care, encompassing medical, emotional, and spiritual support, these facilities help ensure quality of life at the end-of-life. Having hospice residences within reach across our communities means that every resident can spend their final days in dignity, comfort, and peace, surrounded by the people they love.

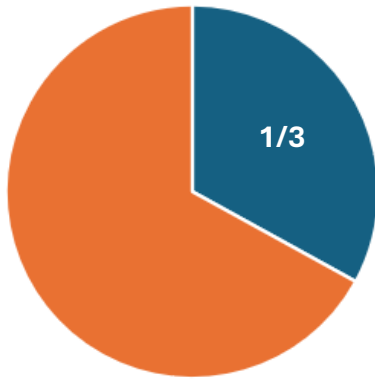

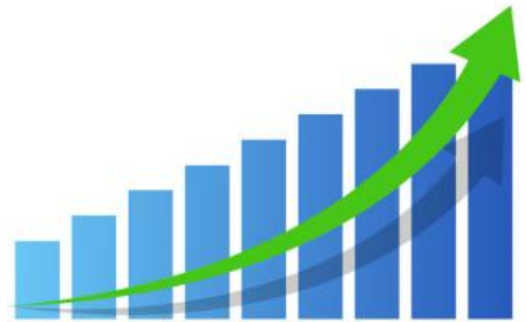

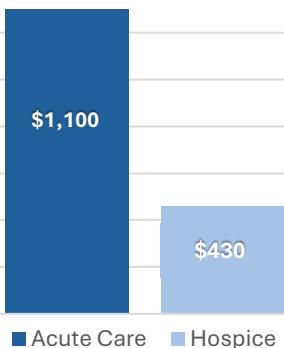

Bridging The Gap in End-of-life Care

Durham Region currently falls well below provincial standards for hospice bed availability. Ontario's Auditor General recommends seven to 10 beds per 100,000 people: with currently fewer than 20 hospice beds to serve a population of 750,000. Simply put, there are not enough hospice residence beds to serve our growing region.

This gap in care places added pressure on hospitals, where end-of-life individuals occupy acute care beds, spaces designated for intensive medical intervention, rather than palliative support. These beds are more costly, nearly three times more expensive than hospice accommodation, and less suited to holistic needs of people nearing the end-of-life. The result is a healthcare system stretched thinly, and patients receiving care in environments that cannot fully meet their emotional, spiritual, and physical needs.

When Hospice Whitby - Roger Anderson House opens its doors, it will **immediately transform**

the landscape of compassionate care in

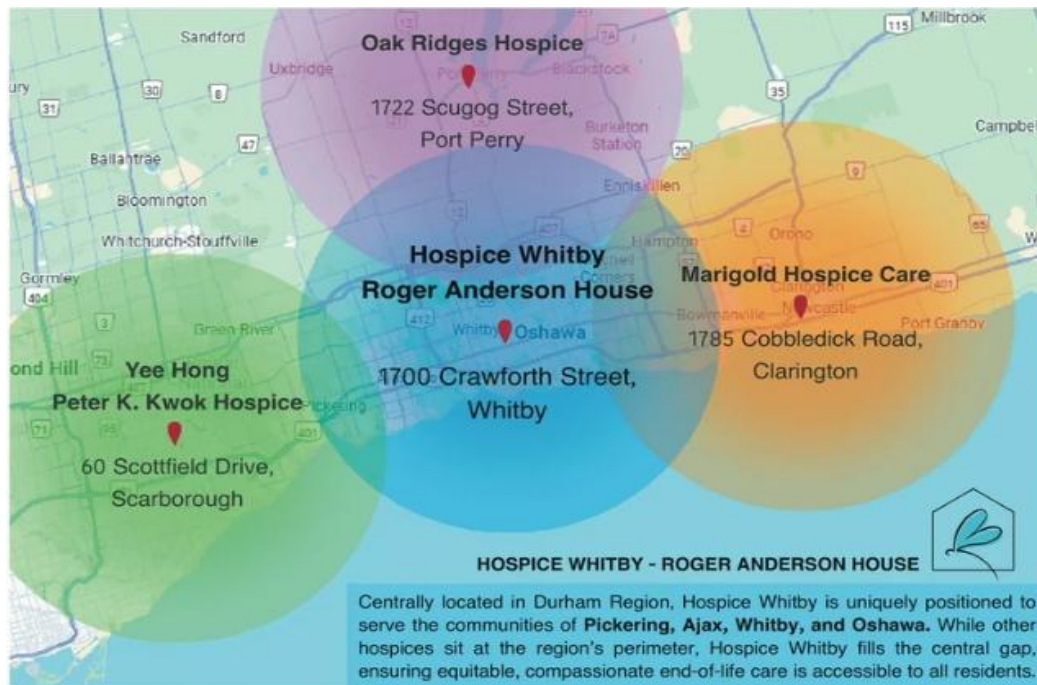
Durham Region. Joining Marigold Hospice Care in Clarington, Oak Ridges Hospice in Port Perry, and Yee Hong Peter K. Kwok Hospice in Scarborough, Hospice Whitby - Roger Anderson House will complement a vital network of hospice residences, bridging a critical gap in local healthcare systems, and offering dignity, comfort, and compassionate care close to home.

Hospice Whitby - Roger Anderson House is located northeast of Thickson Road and Dundas Street, Whitby. This new hospice residence will have far-reaching, measurable, and lasting impact across Durham Region.



Hospice Residences

Whitby, Clarington, Port Perry & Scarborough



We are fortunate to have exceptional hospice residences in Clarington, Port Perry, and Scarborough, each providing compassionate care to families across the region. For the **residents in Oshawa, Whitby, Ajax, and Pickering however, these locations are 25–40 km away**, often requiring up to 60-80 minutes of round-trip travel daily. For caregivers balancing work, family and other responsibilities, this distance can be a significant barrier to consistent presence and support for their loved ones.

Hospice Whitby – Roger Anderson offers unmatched accessibility for families in the central and western parts of Durham Region. Located just two minutes from the Durham Region Transit hub at Thickson Road and Dundas Street, Whitby, it is easily accessible by public transit or by car. This proximity ensures that families, regardless of income, mobility, or transportation access, can visit often, stay longer, and be present when it matters most.

These four communities represent over **77% of Durham Region's total population**, underscoring the urgent need for accessible hospice residence in the central and western parts of the region. **Hospice Whitby strengthens the regional network** by making compassionate end-of-life care truly reachable. It does not replace the value of existing hospices; it complements them by ensuring equitable access across the region.

It is not just about convenience, it's about compassion, comfort, and the **priceless gift of time**. Hospice Whitby – Roger Anderson House ensures that no family is left navigating end-of-life care from a distance. It keeps families together and brings end-of-life care close to home.

What Hospice Whitby Offers

Hospice Whitby – Roger Anderson House is purpose-built: prioritizing privacy, family spaces, and a non-clinical atmosphere that supports meaningful moments together with loved ones; features proven to improve family satisfaction and bereavement outcomes. Hospice is a place that feels like home.

What is included:

- 10 private suites overlooking green spaces each with a private outdoor patio
- 24/7 compassionate care
- Multi-disciplinary team of health-care professionals including doctors, nurses, social workers, counsellors, and volunteers who are trained in end-of-life care
- Emotional and spiritual support, arts, music, and holistic practices
- Meals based on each resident's choice
- Children's outdoor and indoor play areas
- Therapeutic resident spa room
- Unrestricted visiting hours
- Assistance with comfort measures and pain management
- Support and counselling for residents and their loved ones
- Pets welcome
- Free parking
